What Does an RPO Analyst Do?

An internal business consultant who manages projects, analyzes data, and creates and delivers presentations to FBI senior executives.

In some units, a business analyst may have a more technical focus and be a critical resource who configures, analyzes, adapts, and develops new IT processes and systems.

- Formulate and communicate executive strategy
- Manage financial assets
- Own and develop business processes
- Manage threats and resource allocation
- Provide **analytical insights** into key concerns for the organization
- Manage enterprise-wide policy
- Conduct business intelligence reporting and analysis
