**MBA Foundation Course Information** The MBA foundation course component is designed to provide the essential business knowledge and skills required for successful completion of the MBA program. The undergraduate foundation courses provide a non-business undergraduate student a knowledge-base comparable to that of a student with an undergraduate business degree. *Students admitted Fall 2007 or later: Before students enroll in MBA courses, with the exception of MMIS 500 and MBUS 501A, all foundation courses must be completed*

**MMIS Foundation Course Information** *No more than 9 graduate-level credits can be taken prior to completion of all foundation courses.*

### Foundation Course Waiver Information

Some or all of the foundation courses may be waived through a variety of means:

- ✓ Completion of comparable coursework from a regionally accredited college or university with a grade of "B" or higher, and completed within the last ten years from date of admission to the MBA program.
- ✓ Successfully passing an examination addressing the course content. A foundation course may be challenged by exam only one time.
  - CLEP Exam **OR**
  - Faculty-developed exam, administered at discretion of business faculty.

It is the responsibility of the MBA applicant to demonstrate why/how a foundation course should be waived.

Waivers are not granted based solely on work experience. The MMIS and MBA faculty make the final determination of a waiver.

**Effective Fall 2008: All MBA, MSMIS, and Dual Degree students who earn a grade of "C-" or lower in a foundation course completed at UMW must retake the course and earn a "C" or higher.**
