**Topline 2: For Release September 23, 2022** 

NOTE: Some survey questions are being held for subsequent release

The University of Mary Washington's Virginia Survey Fall 2022 was conducted by Research America Inc. during September 6 to 12, 2022. The total sample included 1,000 Virginia residents, including 819 registered voters and 705 likely voters. Part of the sample (630) was contacted by phone (72 percent cell and 28 percent landline), and part of the sample (370) was contacted online. All interviews were in English. Statistical results are weighted to correct known demographic discrepancies, including age, gender and race/ethnicity. The margin of error on the total sample is +/- 3.1%. The margin of error on the Likely Voters portion of the sample is +/- 4.1%."
